MOOT PROPOSITION



7TH C.L. AGRAWAL MEMORIAL NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION 2023





MOOT PROPOSITION

- **1.** BRT India Ltd. Mumbai (BRT)- a mass media Company which is in the business of the production of television serials produced a TV serial originally in Hindi Language. The Serial was titled as Jack and Jill.
- 2. On 8th January 2017, The BRT assigned the dubbing and telecasting rights of Jack and Jill serial to the Magnum TV Productions India Ltd, Bangalore (MTVPIL). Additionally, the MTVPIL was too required to take necessary measures to ensure this TV serial's telecasting by the satellites of the locally operating TV Channels from 26th January 2017 to 30th September, 2019.
- **3.** As per terms of the Agreement with the BRT, the MTVPIL itself dubbed the Jack an Jill serial in Bangla language. On 18th January, 2017, It appointed Hatt Video Solutions, Mumbai (HVS) as its business partner to ensure effective telecasting of Bangla dubbed Jack and Jill serial by different TV Channels in the potential market.
- **4.** On 20th January 2017, HVS concluded agreements with three locally functional TV Channels; namely, Channel 10 Bangla, NDTV Bangla and Bangla TV to ensure the effective telecast of the serial by their satellites during the period of 26th January 2017 to 30th Sept. 2019.
- **5.** On 24th January 2017, all three TV Channels circulated the advertisements in various Bangla language Newspapers informing the general public that the Bangla dubbed version of the Jack and Jill Hindi TV serial will be telecasted at different time slots on their respective TV Channels from 26th January 2017 to 30th September 2019.
- **6.** Considering this telecast against their economic interest, the Adhikari Media Productions, Kolkata (AMP) and the Association of Film and TV Artists of West Bengal (Association) launched a wide spread violent agitation all across the State of West Bengal to prevent aforementioned TV Channels from telecasting the Bangla dubbed Jack and Jill serial.
- 7. On March 18th 2017, the Office of Channel 10 Bangla received a letter from Association. This letter contained a warning to the channel to be ready to face dire consequences if the dubbed Jack and Jill serial would be telecasted in the West Bengal. Additionally, the Association also threatened the Channel that it will conduct violent protests throughout the State if this telecast could not be stopped immediately.





- **8.** NDTV Bangla and Bangla TV also received the similar warning letters from AMP and Association. Letters containing the similar threatening contents were too received by MTVPIL and HVS at their Office by Post on 20th March, 2017. Consequently, the telecast of the Bangla dubbed Jack and Jill serial was stopped by all the Channels on March 22, 2017.
- 9. The gist of all warning letters may be understood as raising a sufficient apprehension that instant violent protests were bound to take place by the active involvement of AMP and Association which were pretending to be taking these pressurizing measures to protect the West Bengal Film and TV Industry. The exercises undertaken, statements made or preparations done by AMP and Association were reflecting the impression of the formation of some type of the Cartel or even of a Bid Rigging Exercise to stop the telecast of this TV serial throughout the State of West Bengal.
- 10. Additionally, the AMP and Association were also claiming to be safeguarding a long established business practice of the media industry of the State of West Bengal. Actually, they, by their actions, were claiming that they never allowed the telecast of any TV Serial or Film in the State of West Bengal if the same was produced originally in the language other than Bangla but dubbed in Bangla language. In this bid, the AMP and Association were jointly engaged in pressurizing the said Channels to stop the telecast of Bangla dubbed Jack and Jill serial in the West Bengal.
- 11. After getting information about these developments and thinking that the said Channels had succumbed to the pressure of AMP and Association, the BRT reported all the facts to the Competition Commission of India (CCI) on 10th April, 2017. In its Complaint, the BRT prayed to the CCI to take appropriate action.
- 12. In its Complaint, the BRT mainly stated that the acts and omissions on the part of AMP and Association were in direct violation to the Sections 3, 4 of the Competition Act, 2002 as the same being Anti-Competitive Agreements having appreciable adverse effect (AAE) on the free competition in the relevant market. Consequently, the AMP and Association were abusing their dominance in the market by indulging in such practices which had resulted in denial of free access of dubbed Jack and Jill serial in the relevant market.





- 13. Additionally, it also prayed to give immediate relief by issuing necessary directions to the Respondents to stop threatening the violence so that such Anti-competitive Arrangements and consequent abuse of dominant position may be countered effectively. It also prayed the CCI to take all necessary measures to provide such suitable environment which would best fit to the effective telecast of the Bangla dubbed Jack and Jill TV serial all across the available market.
- 14. On receiving the information and making a prima facie opinion that the acts and omissions on the part of the AMP and Association have contravened the said provisions of the Act, the CCI referred the matter to the Director General (DG) for a detailed investigation on 10th July, 2017.
- 15. In its Report, the DG concluded that the facts reported by the BRT were correct and the acts and omissions on the part of Respondents have actually amounted to the contravention of the said sections of the Competition Act 2002. Resultantly, the CCI formed the opinion that actions of the Respondents were anti-competitive in nature and resulted in the abuse of dominant position in the relevant market of the West Bengal. Hence, the Respondents were liable for the violation of the relevant provisions of the said Act.
- **16**. On 15th November, 2017, the CCI ordered to the Respondents to discontinue all such practices which were pressurizing the Channels to stop the telecast of dubbed Jack and Jill serial and stop abusing their dominant position. Additionally, it also ordered the imposition of Fine of Rs. 100 Crore on the Respondents.
- 17. In Appeal, the Respondents approached to the Competition Appellate Tribunal on 15th December 2017(Now the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) because the powers and functions of Competition Appellate Tribunal have been takenover by the NCLAT from May 26, 2017). But in its decision on 14th May 2018, the NCLAT maintained the Original Order passed by the CCI on 15th November, 2017.
- **18**. On 20th July 2018, the AMP and Association have filed Second Appeal before the Hon'ble Supreme Court praying for quashing the order and also, requesting to secure any other appropriate remedy.





The following issues have been framed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court:

- 1. Whether the Second Appeal filed before the Supreme Court under Section 53T of the Act is maintainable?
- 2. Whether the BRT India Ltd. Mumbai has locus-standi to lodge the Complaint in the present matter?
- 3. Whether the original Order made by the CCI on 15th November, 2017 and sustained by the NCLAT in its decision on 14th May 2018 was made within the appropriate competence?
- 4. Whether the Order made by CCI and sustained by the NCLAT has caused any injustice to the Appellants? If yes, then;
 - i. Whether the acts and omissions on the part of AMP and Association were sufficient to conclude that they entered in any Anti-competitive Agreement or have abused their dominant position in the Relevant Market?
 - ii. Whether the DG proceeded validly within the due competence in concluding that these were solely the acts/omissions/practices of respondents that have caused the unfair pressure and obstructed the telecast of Jack and Jill Serial and resultantly the TV Channels faced the damages?
 - **iii.** Whether the CCI acted rightly in concluding that the Relevant Market in the present case was the Film and TV Industry of State of West Bengal and was not located on Pan-India basis?

Now, the matter is listed for hearing and arguments before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.


Moot Court, Raffles University

- 1. Team composition and eligibility criteria
- i. Each team shall comprise of three (3) members out of which two (2) will be speakers and one (1) researcher. An observer is allowed to be brought to the competition with a condition that he/she shall not intervene in any proceedings.
- ii. The competition is open for bonafide students pursuing 5 Years and 3 Years Law programs in India.
- iii. Each Law College shall be eligible to send one team. Each team shall be provided with the TEAM CODE. Team should not disclose the identity of their institution in course of proceedings in the court rooms; such disclosure shall invite penalties including disqualification.

2. Registration

- i. The teams are requested to send an e-copy of the Registration Form to mcc@rafflesuniversity.edu.in on or before 07-02-2023.
- ii. A registration fee (Non-Refundable) of Rs. 4500/- (Rupees Four Thousand and Five Hundred Only) is to be paid by way of Online Money Transfer / UPI / Paytm / Google in favour of Raffles University. The charges for observer will be Rs. 800 (Eight Hundred only) per day.

- iv. No change in the names of the participants shall be permitted after the receipt of the Registration Form, except at the sole discretion of the Organizers.
- v. Teams should clearly mention the participants name including year/ semester of study.
- vi. The moot court will be conducted on Date: 3rd March to 5th March 2023. The inauguration function will commence sharp at 05:30 PM on 03/03/2023 followed by draw of lots.

3. Dress Code

Inside the court room the participant shall strictly follow the below mentioned dress code.

- i. Females: White Salvar kurta & Dupatta or white shirt and black Trousers along with black coat and tie.
- **ii. Males:** Whi<mark>te shirt, black trousers, black tie along with black coat and black shoes.</mark>

4. Competition Rounds

There shall be two preliminary rounds, octa-finals, quarter finals, semifinals and a final round spreading over a period of 3 days.

I. Preliminary Rounds

- i. In preliminary rounds each team shall argue from both the sides (Plaintiff and Defendant).
- ii. The team shall be credited with a win in a preliminary round if their round total is more than opposing team.
- **iii.** The marks of the EACH preliminary round shall be the cumulative total of the marks of both the speakers and the marks of the memorial of the side in which they are appearing.
- iv. The total marks of the preliminary rounds shall be the sum total of the marks of both the prelim rounds.
- v. No team shall face each other more than once in the preliminary rounds.
- vi. TOP SIXTEEN (16) teams shall move to the Octa finals on the basis of the marks of the preliminary rounds.
- **vii.** The following criteria shall be observed in deciding teams which are to move forward to octa-finals.
- a) The teams that have Two wins in preliminary rounds shall proceed to the octa-finals.
- **b)** In case less than 16 teams are able to score two wins then teams that have 1:1win loss ratio shall advance based on their aggregate score in the Preliminary Rounds.
- c) Teams that have Two wins shall be given preference over those which have 1 win and 1 loss.
- viii. In case of a tie between two or more teams, the aggregate total of the score of oral submissions of the speakers shall be taken into consideration.





II. Octa-finals

- i. Happening of Octa-finals is subject to change in case participating teams' number is less than 30.
- **ii.** It shall be a knock-out round and the winner of each round shall move forward to the quarter finals.
- **iii**. The criteria of marking in this round are aggregate total of the marks of both the speakers and the marks of memorial of the side in which they are appearing.
- iv. In case of tie between teams, in octa-finals, the aggregate total of the marks of memorials (Plaintiff and Defendant) of the teams shall be counted. Team with highest marks moves ahead.

III. Quarter Finals

- i. Eight (8) teams shall compete in quarter final. Criteria for qualifying to quarter finals have been mentioned in previous clauses.
- ii. It shall be a knock out round. The winner of each round shall move to the semi-final. Four (4) teams shall move to semi-finals.
- **iii.** The criteria of marking in this round are aggregate total of the marks of both the speakers and the marks of memorial of the side in which they are appearing.
- iv. In case of tie between teams, in quarter finals, the aggregate total of the marks of memorials (Plaintiff and Defendant) of the teams shall be counted. Team with highest marks moves ahead.

IV. Semi Finals / Final

- i. Four (4) teams shall compete in semifinals. The criteria of qualifying in semifinals have been mentioned in pervious clauses.
- **ii.** It shall be a knock out round. The winner of each round shall move to the final.
- iii. The criteria of marking in this round are aggregate total of the marks of both the speakers and marks of the memorial of the side in which they are appearing.
- iv. In case of tie between team, in semifinals, the aggregate total of the marks of memorials (Plaintiff and Defendant) of the teams shall be counted. Team with highest marks moves ahead.
- v. There shall be one (I) FINAL Round.
- vi. The marking criteria in Final Round is same as that of semifinal [clause IV, (iii)].

Note: The teams shall be allotted their respective sides through draw of lots.

5. Memorial

i. All teams must submit Memorials/Written Submissions for both sides. (Plaintiff-Defendant).





- ii. Participants must at least frame 3 issues.
- iii. Memorials must contain the following:
 - a) Cover page / Cause title
 - b) Index
 - c) Index of Authorities
 - d) Statement of Jurisdiction
 - e) Synopsis of Facts
 - f) Summary of Arguments
 - g) Arguments / Pleadings
 - h) Conclusion / Prayer.
- iv. The Arguments shall not exceed thirty (30) pages.
- v. The Memorial shall be typed on A4 size page in Font type: Times New Roman, Font size: 12, 1.5-line spacing & 1-inch margin on each side. For citation Blue Book 20th edition must be followed.
- vi. The Cover Page of the Memorial must follow the following color scheme, Blue for the Plaintiff Cover Page and Red for the Defendant Cover Page.
- **vii.** The Memorial must be "spiral binding" ONLY. No services regarding spiral binding will be provided by the university.
- viii. If any team needs to get photocopies done in the university, it would be charged.
- ix. The Memorial must not contain any Annexure/Photographs/ Sketches/ Exhibits / Affidavits etc.
- **x.** Memorials that do not comply with the above-mentioned specifications will be fined.
- xi. Soft copy for each side (Plaintiff and Defendant) must reach the organizers latest by 22-02-2023 to Moot Court Committee mccerafflesuniversity.edu.in, and hard copy of the same and compendium shall reach the School of Law, Raffles University, Japanese Zone, NH-48, Neemrana-301705 District- Alwar, Rajasthan, India latest by 25-02-2023. Total of 5 hard copies have to be submitted to the organizers out of which 2 of each side are to be delivered by 25-02-2023.
- xii. Identification of any type shall attract severe penalty.

Marking Criteria for Memorials

- i. Memorial from each side shall carry total of hundred (100) marks.
- ii. The following shall be the criteria for marking the memorials.

iii. A penalty of two (2) marks for each side of memorial shall be entailed on each day default in submissions of memorials.

6. ORAL SUBMISSIONS

- i. Each team shall comprise of two (2) speakers, as has been specified earlier.
 ii. Each team will have a maximum of thirty (30) minutes to present their Oral Submissions in Preliminary Rounds. No speaker will be permitted to address the Court for more than seventeen (17) minutes. This includes the time the speaker
- addresses the Court during the rebuttal. The maximum time for rebuttal is five (5) minutes.
- iii. Passing of chits will only be allowed during Preliminary rounds. The maximum time allotted in octa and quarter finals is forty (40) minutes for oral submission and no speaker will be permitted to address the Court for more than twenty-two (22) minutes inclusive of five (5) minutes for rebuttal.
- iv. The semifinal rounds will be of Forty- Five (45) minutes and final round will be of fifty (50) minutes for each team. No speaker shall be allowed to address the court for more than twenty-five (25) minutes and twenty- eight (28) respectively.
- v. At the commencement of each session of Oral Submissions each team shall notify the Court Officer as to the division of time between the 2 speakers.
- vi. If any speaker continues to speak after the completion of his / her time, he/she shall entail penalty which shall be upon the discretion of the judges.
- vii. Speakers shall not be allowed to pass annexure to the judges; instead, the teams may make a compendium of annexure that shall be given to the judges before the start of proceedings
- **viii.** During the course of the Oral Submissions no speaker shall reveal his / her identity nor the identity of their University / College by any means whatsoever.





Marking Criteria for the Arguments:

- i. Each Speaker will be marked on a total of 100 marks by each Bench Judge.
- **ii.** The following will be the Marking Criteria and the Marks allocated to each Speaker by each Judge in the Round:

- iii. Rs. 5000/- Cash Prize and Trophy to the Best Speaker.
- iv. Rs. 7000/- Cash Prize and Trophy for the Best Memorial.





8. Miscellaneous

i. No team or any of its members or anyone connected with any team will be permitted to sit or hear the arguments in any court room in which that team is not one of the contesting teams while that team is competing in the competition. For the violation of this rule strict action may be taken against the team, even ranging to the disqualification of the team from the competition. The Organizers reserve the right to take appropriate action for any unethical, unprofessional and immoral conduct.

ii. If there is any dispute in regard to the interpretations of the rules or with respect to any matter related to the competition which is not contemplated in the rules, the decision of the Organizers shall be binding and final.
